### 80 children from 56 families!

A fact finding survey by the childline team! 56 migrant families from 8 different districts of Karnataka! 80 children belonging to the agegroup of 01 to 16! Tharched shelters and pathetic living condition! Report is sent to the authorities for action!

150 children from

101 families staying

in miserable living

conditions for finding

their livelihood

Guttur is a village in Harihara taluk of Davangere towards the border of Haveri district. It is known for its quality red bricks used for construction in Karnataka. A lot of

people migrate to this village to find job in these brick making units and live in temporary sheds. Moved by the pathetic condition that they saw during their first fact finding visit to Guttur DBCLM took up a second survey the magnitude

of the problem the whole childline team went in different groups and surveyed the locality. At the end of the day when they compiled the data they had visited 56 migrant families from 08 different districts of Karnataka. There were also 80 children belonging to the different age group of 01 to 16. The data show that there are 29 families from Vijayapura, 17 from Haveri, 04 from Davangere, 02 from

from Darwad and 01 each from Ballari, Gadag, Gulberga and Yadgiri. Out of the 80 children 47 are boys and 33 are girls. 50 children (29 boys and 21 girls) in this 80,

29 families of Vijayapura.21 children (12 boys and 9 girls belong to the 17families from Haveri. 03 boys belonged to the families from 04 families from from Davanagere. 02 boys belonged to the 02 families of Dharwad. A boy each belonged

to the families of Gulberga, Ballari and Yadgiri and a girl belong to the family from Gadag. The team soon made a proper report compiling the data of the first and second visits and submitted to the concerned authorities for further action. Putting together both the visits the team met 101 and families and found 158 children living with these families in miserable living condition.

In addition to the three child marriages prevented successfully in January DBCLM successfully stopped two more marriage attempts in February. It was always a well coordinated and timely intervention of DBCLM, Childline, Police department, CDPO unit, and other concerned authorities.

Alerted by a phone call about a possible child marriage the team reached Adaapur village in Harihara taluk on February 03. On verifying the documents they found that the girl is a minor and discouraged the from entering into the marriage. The second case took place on 19th at Kumbaluru of Harihara taluk. The team reached the place and prevented the marriage since the girl was found minor. It was also an opportunity to spread awareness about this evil.

As there is a greater awareness on the need to become more eco friendly and need of sustainable development programmes, more and more villages and schools are ready to accept the idea of having a vegetable garden, that too an organic one, for their own consumption. The idea of ECO clubs in this line is slowly getting accepted in more

and more schools in Davangere too. Since it is a pilot project, DBCLM has proposed only to a few government schools in the operational area. In addition to the three clubs inaugurated in January three more clubs are formed in February.

The first one was formed in GUHPS, Anagodu on February 03. There were 109 students present excluding the teachers and other adults. The second was formed on February 04 in GHPS, Kadajji in the presence of 110 children and other. The last one was on February 07 in GHPS Mellakatte in the presence of 72 students.

In the following 06 visits it was heartening to see students with their responsible teachers spending their time and energy to have the pride of owning an organic vegetable garden. The Head Master in Mellakatte school even took the trouble of spending his own money and procuring the tools and articles necessary to work in the garden. Many of such responsible people and the club members are waiting for decent harvest.

### Agent of Change...

DBCLM functions as an agent of change through the social activists of different projects, community workers/ tuition teachers of 25 villages and most importantly through children who are members of Child Rights Clubs and Educate to Cultivate Organic Clubs in three taluks of Davangere and one taluk of Ballari districts.

DBCLM believes that prevention is better than cure. And so together with eradication of social evils against children DBCLM also tries to prevent it at the roots. One best way of doing it is to make people aware of it, in the first place making the children aware of their rights and then educating the society to accept them as citizens and allowing them to enjoy it. And so DBCLM prepares both children and the society through a variety of interventions. DBCLM conductes a number of awareness programmes on child rights and child related

issues. Then different clubs and groups are formed to demand their rights. At the same time there are different committees formed and trained to create a mechanism to protect children and their rights. These committees include Child Protection Committees, Task Forces, etc. In addition to these different training programmes are also conducted for different group of people like Self Help Group members, teachers, government officials, etc. Below is the statistics of such programmes conducted.
