

## Childline: 24-hour helpline for Children

Reached out to 3554 people including 60 people in the flood relief camp at Harihara through Awareness Programmes, Day and Night Reachout Programmes, Open House, Stall Awareness Programmes and phone calls received in childline helpline no 1098 and other interventions.

The Don Bosco Childline Collab, Davangere team reached out to 579 boys, 691 girls and 48 adults through 14 Awareness Sessions conducted at different places in the city on childline and its services, child

marriage, child abuse, protection against abuses, protection mechanism, online safey, POCSO, etc.

There was a Night Outreach to old and new



bus stations and differnt market places wherein the team came in contact with 105 people. Day Outreach reached out to a total of 1306 people, including those 60 at the flood relief centre at Harihara, through 25 reachouts.

The Open House of this month had 30 boys, 51 girls and 48

adults. There was also a case of intervention registered at the end of the open house. Through the 02 Stall Awareness Programmes the project reached out to 125 boys, 130 girls and 340 adults in the city.



## Just a Call away...

Reached out to 112 children (69 boys and 43 girls) through a total of 103 calls to 1098, including the 10 calls from outreach programmes

Out of the 103 calls received 10 calls were for referals to other institutions. Rest of the 93 calls were aimed at interventions on Begging Children (8), Child Marriage (7), Counselling Help (3), Education related (22), Emotional Abuse (6), Family Related issues (3), Information Related (1), Kidnap (1), Medical Help (16), Missing Case (5), Physical Abuse (10), School Dropout (16), Sponsorship (1), Trafficking (2) and Verbal Abuse (1).



#### Rakshabandhan

The students of Residential Bridge Course and Open Shelter project of DBCLM had a meaningful celebration of Rakshabandhan on August 17, 2019. After a short narration of the celebration they had the chance of tying the rakhi and exchanging sweets.

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#### **Provincial Visitation**

DBCLM had the joy of having Rev. Fr. Joyce Thonikuzhiyil, Provincial of Bangalore province for the annual visitation on August 19 and 20, 2019. He visted both centres and addressed the salesians and the lay staff separately. There was also a get together.





#### **Empowering the Community**

Five Child Rights Club Formation programmes were conducted by the CS Project in August in different schools of the project area. The training could reach out to 170 boys and 169 girls. There was also 01 training for Grama Panchayath Members and 03 trainings for Asha Workers in which 33 Gram Panchayath members and 59 asha workers of the project area participated.

The 15 tuition centres in the 15 villages of Jagalur Taluk too continue to function with an average of 30 to 40 children per day. Effective intervensions are being done to bring back the irregular students to the schools.

## Making them think...

A new project called Thinking Through Philosophy is on at DBCLM, to improve the thinking capacity of the children.

TTP is a project aimed at making children think. To facilitate the process of thinking, children are divided into groups and a facilitator, after a calming down exercise narrates a story. At the end of the story he asks them some philosophical questions based on the theme of the story and makes them think and answer. Then they are asked to come back to the class after a week with their experience.

# Everyone Counted...

49 child-missing cases, 04 traced children, 11 unaccompanied children in the childcare homes and 01 awareness programme

Investigation is still on and efforts are being made by the MCB and police department to trace the 40 missing children of Davangere. There are another 09 (03 boys and 06 girls) cases of children missing registered in August in addition to the 40 of July. Out of this 09 they could trace 04 (03 boys and 01 girl) by the end of August. Now there are 45 children to be traced in Davangere alone.

By the end of July there were 10 unaccompanied children in the child care homes of Davangere. 01 more girl was added to the

list in August taking the number to 11. No home placement has been made in August.

The coordinator could conduct an awareness programme in the city wherein 30 boys and 15 girls participated. He explained about MCB and its services to the group.

With the admission of 04 new boys in this month the number of children attending the residential bridge course in DBCLM has reached 25 (16 boys and 09 girls) now. These are deserving children who were begging (02 girls), child labourers (01 boy), or school dropouts (12 boys and 03 girls).

The others are from broken families (2 boys and 2 girls), migrant families (1 boy and 2 girls). They attend regular classes and participate in various extra-curricular activities organized at the centre time to time and on some special days like, world sports day, world tourism day, teachers' day, etc.
